**Swara (Singing Club)**

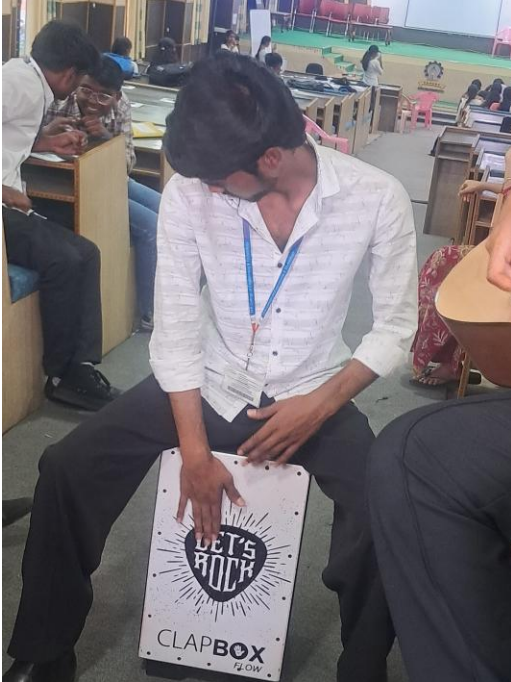
