#### MINUTES

### Unit I: Items for Consideration and Approval

01 AC_SEP 21	Ammendent of Implying Grace Marks & Exemption to R-17 Regulation Students only as per Lr.No. EB/375/2021, date:25.08.2021 by Director of Evaluation, JNTUH.

As per the Academic Regulations of TKR-R17, the UG students admitted in TKR-R17 regulation are eligible for the award of the degree if the student register for 192 credits and attains 192 credits. But, as per JNTUH R16 regulations, the UG students are eligible for the award of the degree if the student registers for 192 credits and attains 186 credits. In JNTUH, the aggregate CGPA has been calculated for 186 credits only. The students will be having the benefit of leaving 6 credits i.e., these 6 credits will not be counted for calculating aggregate CGPA. Accordingly, the students can avail the benefit of leaving 6 credits. Further, in JNTUH the students are eligible to apply for 0.15% of grace marks (to a maximum of two subjects) in addition to 6 credits exemption.

But, in TKR-R17 academic regulations, the UG students can not avail these two benefits. Many students have submitted their representations to the Principal, requesting grace marks and exemption of 6 credits.

If the exemption of 6 credits is included to our students, approximately 167 students will get benefitted as on today with B.Tech IV-II Results. More number of students will get this benefit after declaring the supplementary results as the results are processing. Hence, the percentage of students getting degree will also increase.

The following guidelines for exemption & grace marks are proposed by the examination branch of TKRCET inline to JNTUH and submitted for your approval.

1. The Students after securing the necessary 192 credits as specified for the successful completion of the entire under graduate programme as per TKR-R17 academic regulations, the student can avail exemption of two subjects up to 6 credits, that is, resulting in 186 credits for under graduate programme performance evaluation, i.e., the performance of the student in these 186 credits shall alone be taken into account for the calculation of 'the final CGPA (at the end of under graduate programme, which takes the SGPA of the IV year II semester into account). However, the performance of student in the earlier individual semesters, with the corresponding SGPA and CGPA for which grade cards have already been given will not be altered.

- 2. If a student registers for some more 'extra subjects' (in the parent department or other departments/branches of engg.) other than those listed subjects totaling to 192 credits as specified in the course structure of his department, the performances in those 'extra subjects' (although evaluated and graded using the same procedure as that of the required 192 credits) will not be taken into account while calculating the SGPA and CGPA. For such 'extra subjects' registered, % of marks and letter grade alone will be indicated in the grade card as a performance measure, subject to completion of the attendance and academic requirements as stated in TKR-R17 academic regulations.
- 3. The students of TKR-R17 who are falling short of a few marks to pass one or two subjects and by adding specified grace marks (less than the eligible grace marks), pass these one or two subjects and secure sufficient credits to obtain their provisional certificate (PC). Simillar to JNTUH regulations, the college requests the approval for giving the maximum grace marks of 10 (for 4 year B.Tech) and 7 marks (for 3 year lateral entry students). The maximum number of subjects to be applied for grace marks is limited to two only.
- 4. The performance in the examinations for which results are awaited and/or CV, shall be nullified if they apply for the PC & CMM under any of these three categories. They shall not be permitted to write any future examinations.
- 5. The students who failed in not more than two subjects and credits of the failed subjects is less than or equal to 6, are only eligible to apply for the credit exemption.
- 6. The subjects shall be shown as Fail in the CMM but since the student secures 186 credits, PC & CMM will be issued. Total number of credits are 192 with exemption of 6 credits it has been considered as 186 on student request only with approval of HOD & Principal.
- 7. The students are informed to approach the examination branch for requisite forms to apply for Grace Marks, Exemption and/or both.

As per the Academic Regulations of TKR-R17, the UG students admitted in TKR-R17 regulation are eligible for the award of the degree if the student register for 192 credits and attains 192 credits. But, as per JNTUH R16 regulations, the UG students are eligible for the award of the degree if the student registers for 192 credits and attains 186 credits. In JNTUH, the aggregate CGPA has been calculated for 186 credits only. The students will be having the benefit of leaving 6 credits i.e., these 6 credits will not be counted for calculating aggregate CGPA. Accordingly, the students can avail the benefit of leaving 6 credits. Further, in JNTUH the students are eligible to apply for 0.15% of grace marks (to a maximum of two subjects) in addition to 6 credits exemption.

But, in TKR-R17 academic regulations, the UG students can not avail these two benefits. Many students have submitted their representations to the Principal, requesting grace marks and exemption of 6 credits.

If the exemption of 6 credits is included to our students, approximately 167 students will get benefitted as on today with B.Tech IV-II Results. More number of students will get this benefit after declaring the supplementary results as the results are processing. Hence, the percentage of students getting degree will also increase.

Sub: JNTUH- Exam Branch- Instruction to students of B. Tech R16 Regulation - Provisional list of candidates eligible for grace marks, credit exemption with an Undertaking - for the issue of PC & CMM - Reg.

1) University order for issue of grace marks dated 17-08-2021.

2) B.Tech., R16 Academic regulations of the University.

College-wise lists of students who are eligible to apply for i) grace marks, ii) credit exemption and iii) grace marks followed by credit exemption have been prepared and made available in the T-Sheets option in the exam portals of the respective Principal logins. For these three categories, the students have to fill-up the appropriate undertaking form (to be downloaded from student service portal) and the Principals have to sign at the appropriate place in the respective forms. These forms need to be either printed on the college letter-head / with a separate covering letters from the Principal enclosing the appropriate form and sent to the office of DE. The performance in the examinations for which results are awaited and/or RC, RV & CV, shall be nullified if they apply for the PC & CMM under any of these three categories. They shall not be permitted to write any future examinations.

The applications received by 28-08-2021 forenoon shall be processed on priority basis and efforts will be made to issue PC & CMM at the earliest possible date. The Principals are requested to note the following rules with regard to grace marks and credit exemption categories.

Those who seek grace marks:

- 1. A separate form (Form-5) earmarked for this category need to be filled up.
- 2. Marks shall be added up to 10 marks for four year B. Tech course in failed subjects and 7 marks for lateral entry students of B.Tech course (maximum of two subjects).

,3. All the semester marks/grade memos from the month/year specified in the list uploaded to portal today, where the subject(s) have been shown as Fail need to be surrendered along with the Filled-in Form (with the Principal endorsement) and the selective new marks/grade memos will be re-issued from the University Examination Branch along with PC & CMM.

Those who seek only credit exemption:

- 1. A separate form (Form-6) earmarked for this category need to be filled up
- 2. The students who failed in not more than two subjects and credits of the failed subjects is less than or equal to 6, are only eligible to apply for the credit exemption.
- The subjects shall be shown as Fail in the CMM but since the student secures 186 credits, PC & CMM will be issued.

Those who seek both grace marks and credit exemption:

- 1. A separate form (Form-7) earmarked for this category need to be filled up
- 2. Points mentioned in the above two cases (grace marks and credit exemption) are applicable.
