INTRODUCTION TO NCC:

The NCC in India was formed with the **National Cadet Corps Act of 1948**. It was raised on 15 July 1948. The National Cadet Corps can be considered as a successor of the University Officers Training Corps (UOTC) which was established by the British in 1942. During World War II, the UOTC never came up to the expectations set by the British. This led to the idea that some better schemes should be formed, which could train more young men in a better way, even during peace times. A committee headed by Pandit H.N. Kunzru recommended a cadet organization to be established in schools and colleges at a national level.

BACKGROUND:

As you are fully aware that NCC plays a vital role in the growth and development of the country by grooming its most precious resource, youth. In order to attain our national goals it is imperative that our training encapsulates and embeds the qualities and attributes in the cadets. Apart from grooming and preparing the youth for the future challenges in NCC, cadets also **get various benefits in terms of job opportunities, scholarships and financial assistance** in times of any tragedy while undergoing any NCC related activity.

INCENTIVES FROM THE CENTRE AND STATE GOVTS ADMISSION IN PRESTIGIOUS EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTES

Many educational institutes have seats reserved for the certificate holders from NOC Preference is given in following fields

- (a) Degree and Diploma courses
- (b) LLB courses
- (c) Govt. Polytechnics and Engineering colleges
- (d) Medical courses.

RESERVED VACANCIES IN EMPLOYMENT

CENTRAL GOVERNMENT JOBS:

Specific vacancies in the Armed Forces via-Army, Air Force and Navy are reserved for NCC C Certificate holder candidates. Students opting for Officer Entry through UPS Care exempted from appearing in written examination and have the opportunity to appear directly at Interview by Service Selection Boards, (558) which is an important incentive as normal students have to toil hard in clearing written examination considering the standard of any UPSC exam. The other various incentives for NCC Certificate holders are as enumerated below.

- (i) **Bonus marks** are awarded in employment in Para Military Forces and Department of Telecommunication
- (ii) Can apply for gazetted post in CRPF if cadet holds third division degree in certificate examinations
- (iii) Employment within NCC Organisation as Whole Time Lady Officer, (WTLO) Girl Cadet Instructor, various Instructor post such as Aero and Ship Modeling Instructor etc.

STATE GOVERNMENT JOBS:

Various states Government provide job incentive to the NCC 'B'/'C' certificate holders for recruitment in following departments:

(a) Police Services.

(b) Transport Department

(c) Forest Department.

(d) Excise Department.

(d) Preference to the girl cadets as nurses, receptionists and telephone operators in various state Government sectors as well as private sector.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE/SCHOLARSHIPS TO THE CADETS. Financial assistance and relief is extended to the cadets by Cadet Welfare Society (CWS), in case of any injury/fatality/accident to the cadet or to their NOK while taking part in NCC related activities.

TRAINING CAMPS CONDUCTED FOR GROOMING OF CADETS. For NCC cadets, Camps are the most exciting and meaningful part of training, wherein cadets get exposure to the merits of NCC. The various camps conducted in NCC are as follows:-

- i. Annual Training Camp (ATC). Intra Group Competition (IGC) Camp.
- ii. All India Nau sainik Camp (AINSC),
- iii. Intra Unit Competition (IUC).
- iv. Republic Day Camp (RDC).

JOINING PROCEDURE:

Minimum qualification for joining NCC: He/ She Age Must Be Above 18 Years.

Mode of Selection: Candidates must have good physic. He/she must qualify the physical events which in done college and interview too.

Duration of the course: Minimum 3 years. After Successful enrolment in NCC and Him/her going to do Certificates course and completion of course HE/SHE Will received 'B' and 'C' certificates.

AIMS OF NCC:

The NCC aims at developing character, comradeship, discipline, and secular outlook, the spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service amongst young citizens.

WHAT ARE THE FEATURES OF NCC?

Type of Examination:

The type of Certificate Examination and the unit in which these are held are given below

Type of Certificate

Certificate 'A'

Certificate 'B' & 'C'

Eligibilities for Certificate Examination:

"B" Certificate Examination(Senior Division)

1. He /She must be in second year of SD/SW NCC Training
2. He /She attend one Annual Training Camp/NIC/Attachment training with regular Army, Navy, Air Force Units.
3. Cadets possessing 'A' Certificate will be awarded 10 bonus marks.
4. The cadet must have attended a minimum of 75% of total training period laid down in the syllabus for the first and second years for Senior Division Wing NCC (All Wings). Break in the NCC service of the cadet SD/SE prior to appearing in the exam should not exceed more than 18 months at one time, after his discharge to count his service for Certificate 'B' Examination. In case the break exceeds 18 months the following procedure will be adopted.

"C" Certificate Examination (Senior Division)

1. He /She Cadet must have passed 'B' certificate.
2. He /She must be in second/third year of SD/SW NCC Training
3. The Cadet must have attended a minimum of 75% of the periods of 3rd year syllabus during the academic session.
4. Break in the NCC Service of the SD/SW Cadet prior to appearing in the exam should not exceed more than 18 months at one time, after his discharge to count his previous service for Certificate 'C' examination. In case the break exceeds 18 months, the following procedure will be adopted.
5. Must have attended two Camp.

Permission to Appear in Certificate Examination after Discharge

Cadets who ceased to be on rolls of NCC may be permitted to appear for certificate 'A' Examination for Junior Division/Wing and 'B' & "C" for Senior Division/Wing NCC at their own expenses within a period of 12 months of their discharge from the NCC, provided they were otherwise eligible at the time of their discharge.

The ex-cadet so eligible can appear for the examination at any place in India by applying for the same, alongside with discharge certificate, to Local Unit Commander. The Group Commander is empowered to accept such requests from the ex-cadets.

Re-Test for Improvement of grading: 'C' Certificate

With a view to give Cadets a chance to apply for the NCC Special Entry Scheme, in case their grading improves, Cadets who have obtained a 'C' grading in NCC 'C' Certificate Exam and who wish to improve their grading will be allowed to appear for a retest. Only one retest will be allowed.

1. Cadets will have to re-appear in complete examination.
2. Retest will be held along with fresh cases next year. During the period, these Cadets may attend at least two weeks' Special Parade/Coaching classes to be organised by units after the academic session. Those Cadets who do not attend the Special Parade/Classes will also be eligible to appear in the re-test. No refreshment or other allowance will be admissible for these classes/parade/retest.

She/he must maintain 75 percentage attendances to all appear certificate exams.
